"That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ² Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³ And he told them many things in parables, saying: 'Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴ And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵ Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. ⁶ But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷ Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸ Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹ Let anyone with ears listen!'" 

Do you want offering envelopes for 2022?


In early 2021, the Finance Committee ordered boxes of offering envelopes for 2022. The committee decided to order fewer boxes for 2022 since many congregants no longer use envelopes to make their offering. Many members give in other ways, such as, by mailing checks directly to the church, paying from their own banks using their "Bill Pay" feature, by QCD's (Qualified Charity Deductions) from their IRA investment accounts being sent directly to the church, or by giving online. Online giving has become a popular method of

supporting the church. One can give online by using a "Give Now" button featured on our website or by using a feature on our weekly Thursday emails. There is also a Mobile App for donating. Soon, one will be able to give online on our Facebook page.

However, there will still be enough boxes for those who desire them. Please leave a message at the church, 732-382-0803, if you would like a box for 2022.

Also, it was decided that the collection for the Initial Offering would be dropped. The intent of this offering over the years was to cover the costs of the envelopes. Initial Offering envelopes will no longer appear in the boxes.

There is much to do even though this is an inside sale, so please consider donating whatever time you can. We are so very grateful for the help.






