From Pastor Ed...

The Lord said to Moses, "Tell the people to go forward into the sea, on dry ground." Ex. 14

Dear Friends,

This has to be one of the most heart-stopping scenes ever. When you read the surrounding verses, it 's pretty clear that Charlton Heston was playing it way too cool in the movie. The people were literally scared to death. They said to Moses, "You had to bring us all the way out here to go to our graves?" Then Moses, took a chance, and replied with a quivering voice, "Uh, just, stay where you are, and watch how we get out of this one." That's when God joined the conversation, and told them plainly, to stop talking, and get moving. I read somewhere, that the *real* miracle of this story is not that the Red Sea waters parted, but that the people actually started moving forward.

This story has to be the premier illustration of the old adage, that "you can never go back". Even when there isn't a hostile army at our heels, what's done is *done*, and consequences have to be dealt with. More than that, this story illustrates the truth that we can't stay still for long either - at least not without its own repercussions. In order to "get somewhere" the only way forward, is *forward*.

The key insight of this story is in what was behind Moses' reply to the people. In a word, it was hope. Hope is about having faith in a future that is yet unaccomplished. It's about turning corners and expecting that there will be some kind of grace waiting there. It's about believing that God's will is *good* - and so, the Spirit will lead us in good directions.

Hope and faith are partners in this. They tell us that since God is the Creator, we can trust that the enterprise of creation will continue until it's completed. They assure us that God isn't finished with any of us either. Until the kingdom comes, there will always be more to learn, more to change, and more to grow. Life is always more than we can see, and we can bet our lives on that. That is good news to carry with us, as we take our first fresh steps into a brand new year.

More than 20 years ago, the Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without even a bowl of soup to eat."

Since that day, more than \$60 million has been raised for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that is transforming Super Bowl weekend into the nation's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving.

At First Pres, we have been collecting canned and boxed food products every year for the past 22 years. All through the month of January our congregation is encouraged to bring their food donations to church each Sunday and place them on the collection display table set in the Narthex. The collection will culminate on Souper Bowl Sunday, February 12th. All items are brought to the Food for Friends food pantry where they will be distributed to families in need.

If you choose to make a monetary donation, the Outreach Committee will send those donations to the Food for Friends soup kitchen that operates out of Davis Hall on Saturdays throughout the year. For the last three years, the lunch program was limited to take-out lunches only due to the pandemic of 2020 and the cautions taken in its aftermath. At the start of the New Year, the sit-down dinners will finally resume. The diners will surely welcome back the camaraderie of eating with their friends. You may send a check to the church office or leave a check in the Sunday offering plate.
