From Pastor Ed...

"Be making yourselves perfect and complete as your heavenly Father is perfect and complete." Mt. 5:48

Dear Friends,

I always feel a little dizzy from the sudden transition between Christmas and the New Year. There's quite a distance, for me, between the joyous warmth of the Christmas season and the inevitable, awkward self-examination I give myself at the start of another year.

It has helped me to learn that Jesus' words at the top of the page are closer to the literal translation. As such, we aren't really asked to "be as perfect as God is." Instead, it's more about being a work in progress. It's more about moving in a positive direction - ongoing "make -overs" for ourselves.

So, as we look over the past year, we want to know if we've learned anything new, about ourselves or life. We want to see if we've made some strides. We want to see if we're doing a better job with the way we live and the things we do. We hope to find that awareness has increased, and faith has deepened, and understanding has grown. Church Angels


The Church Angels will meet on Thursday, January 4th, to work on several areas that need our attention. We would welcome anyone, male or female,

2024 Per Capita Assessment - \$38.00

Our Presbytery, The Presbytery of The Northeast, has announced that the assessment by and for each person on the rolls of its congregations will be \$38.00 for 2024.

The Presbytery of The Northeast is a governing body of the Presbyterian Church USA, which has the responsibility of spreading the Good News that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. Our Presbytery shares its financial and human resources with a regional body called the Synod and a national body called the General Assembly.

A blessing of being a part of a connectional church is that each member of the congregation can help support the work of our denomination through per capita giving. When we each pay our share, we enable our Presbytery – Synod – and General Assembly to do the creative work of the Holy Spirit throughout the world.

It is important that each member of First Pres pay their per capita amount of \$38.00 so that our Church may continue to be faithful in sending our Presbytery the amount we are assessed. We are prayerful that this year, as in past years, our membership will respond. Young and old members, and all those in between, are asked to use the enclosed envelope to reflect your response.

The Souper Bowl of Caring program began in 1990 with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without even a bowl of soup to eat."

Since that time, over thirty years ago, close to \$193 million has been raised for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a pow-



erful movement, with more than 305,000 groups participating, that is transforming Super Bowl weekend into the nation's largest weekend of giving and serving.

At First Pres, we have been collecting canned and boxed food products on Super Bowl Sunday every year for the past 23 years. This year, our congregation is again encouraged to support the Souper Bowl program by bringing food donations to church each Sunday during the month of February. At the end of the month, all items will be brought to the Food for Friends food pantry where they will be distributed to families in need. Our totals are always sent to the Souper Bowl of Caring organization to be added to the national totals.

Last year, at the conclusion of the February collection, our congregation decided to expand our giving by collecting food items three times during the year, in February, June, and October. We now help even more families.

Debbie became involved with an after-school group we had at First Pres., called Achieve to Excel. While I sat in the pew during her memorial service, I decided that I wanted to share the poem that inspired Debbie to do what she did best – love, help, and care for everyone.
