From Pastor Ed...

"Remember the Lord your God, who brought you out of slavery, who fed you in the wilderness, gave you his commandments, and this good land to live in..."

—Deuteronomy 8

Dear Friends,

It's easy to see the connection between this passage from Deuteronomy and our own country with its prosperity and power, and the call to *remember* who is the source of our blessings, and how we got where we are, and how we're called to live in *our* "promised land." But as we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving, I think there's even more that we might want to remember in this season, as people of faith.

Remembering God is about keeping in touch with God's picture of life itself- trying to follow God's ways. It's about having a constant conversation between our faith, and our lives in the world.

In the context of the exodus story and the wilderness journey, remembering the Lord our God is, at it's heart, about *conversion*. The journey of conversion is all about discovering that there's always more than one way to be faithful in this world. It's realizing that the Spirit is ever ready to lead us into deeper faith, and devotion. The journey of conversion means that we will wrestle with the realization that God's way might be quite different from "my way," or the "American way", or the "the way it's always been".

Conversion continually asks, "How much am I willing to learn and change, in order to grow as a person - and as a disciple of Christ?"

It's always up to us, isn't it? We can always refuse to take that journey over Jordan to a new land, that is, towards greater understanding, and a more vital faith and life. But when we refuse, we lose the heart of what Thanksgiving is all about - which is being *joyfully* aware, of where the best blessings we receive, truly come from - and what they are given *for*.

Small Group / Home Meetings On the Horizon!

We will be starting a series of Small Group / Home meetings to learn and share together in relaxed informal settings.

The first important step in the interim process, is to gather stories from the congregation that help us to understand who we are, and

what have been the most meaningful and pivotal points in the life of our congregation. We want to identify what have been our greatest successes, *and struggles*. We want to identify the parts of our heritage that have the most meaning to us, and that generate life and purpose in ways that can carry us into our future.

The second important step in this interim time, is to learn how the culture around the church has changed, and how the church may change in order to discover what God is calling us to be and do. This is a time for identifying old and new ideas, our core values, and *envisioning*, in order to set a *direction* for the church.

We will want our congregation to acquire a clear sense of our relationship with the surrounding community, and what the opportunities may be for connecting in new and deeper ways. Therefore, a variety of "learning opportunities" will be offered, so that our congregation can have a working knowledge of what Session has learned, and is learning.

These learning opportunities will also be offered in small groups, home meetings, 2 hour church "retreats", zoom meetings and more, so that maximum participation can be achieved. If there are persons who are unable to attend these gatherings, there will be handouts available for sharing your stories, and self study.



The times and places for these gatherings will be posted in our Weekly newsletters, congregation wide emails, Sunday announcements, the Tower Chimes, and the Website.

Please be sure to check these various social media venues. If you do not have access to social media, please contact the Church Office, and we will make sure you receive the information.




