Dad and Nana have been gone for years now. I still miss them both every single day. And although my daughter and I both know how to make Nana's special sauce we don't cook it as often as we could. Maybe it is because no matter how hard I try I can never get it 100% right. I think that maybe I am missing an ingredient. Or maybe it was just the Love with which Nana and Dad cooked it that made it so delicious. Either way this winter I am going to make some again. I need its warmth. I need its goodness. And when I cook it with Love, I know that Nana and Dad will be smiling down on me from heaven.

May all your meals be cooked with Love then. May all your days be filled with Love. May your entire life be lived with Love. And may you always feel God's Love smiling down on you.


