From Pastor Ed...

Dear Friends,

When I was growing up (on Ridge Road) I had a friend who had tropical fish. Every once in a while, he'd have to empty the fish tank and thoroughly clean. I happened to be there on one occasion when he had to do this chore. The first thing he did was to fill the bathtub with water, making sure that the temperature was the same as in the fish tank. Then he released his fish into the tub, "to give them a treat" - to let them revel in the wide open waters. Then he and I went into his backyard where he began scrubbing. He loved his fish, so he polished the tank until it was gleaming in the sunlight. The fish castle looked like it belonged in Disneyland, and every piece of fish "furniture" looked like it was fresh from the showroom. So we carried it all triumphantly into the house, filled it with fresh water and new gravel, arranged all the filters and all the fish-homey touches, and went to retrieve the residents from the tub. When we arrived at tub-side, I was surprised to find the fish all together in one corner, in an area *the same size* as their tank. It was as though there were invisible walls containing them there. My friend looked at me and said, "I don't get it. They do that every time," as he scooped them into his net.

There could be a parable for us in that. There are potentially lots of ways that we learn to confine ourselves, or fear life outside of the "fish bowls" we may live in. Maybe we learned that only doing things, or living a certain way, is "acceptable." Maybe we've been confined by the" walls" that guard us against being spontaneous, or reaching out, or inquiring more deeply into life's possibilities. Maybe we live inside fences that confine our beliefs - about God, and life, and spirituality, and ministry, and more

One of the most helpful opportunities that Lent can bring, is the time and space to reflect on our lives, in light of the gospel. One thing Jesus brings home to us is that our faith invites to enter into a larger life. If we are listening, the Spirit is ever inviting us to explore, and experience life to its fullest. The Spirit invites us to risk venturing even into the places where pain and difficulty may be - if only to discover that God is there too - strengthening us and supporting us. Jesus taught that the more we venture "outside the bowl" the more we'll know the abundant life Jesus makes possible. As we continue our Lenten journey this month, let's ask the Spirit to reveal the invisible "walls" whatever they may be, that confine us. Let's find the time and space to listen for what our next steps of faith and growth and transformation may be. If we do, we may enter more deeply into the possibilities that Easter morning brings. We may also be surprised and blessed, by the greater difference we can be part of making in our community, as his disciples.




Church Angels

On February 25th, we had our first Saturday retreat! The purpose of such retreats is to provide a time for learning some of the latest information about church transformation and growth, and envisioning authentic possibilities for the church. Furthermore each gathering works to develop next steps that our congregation can *do*, guided by the following acronym S.M.A.R.T. which

stands for Specific, Measurable, Actionable, Realistic, with a Timeline.

SO, the following initiatives are the result of our first retreat:

- 1. Our Session will be transforming the ways it does its work to make planning, and implementation of various ministries easier, more focused. and flexible. Session will be focusing more on equipping people in the congregation to use their gifts! This forward focus will be guided by three questions: What do you want to do?, What do you need?, and How is it going?

- 6. All committees and other groups in the church will employ the practices that characterize small group ministry.

There will be more opportunities coming on the horizon to participate in Saturday retreats, coffee hour information presentations and more. Everyone is enthusiastically invited to come!
