Jesus said to Mary, "Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father..." In 20:16-17

Dear Friends,

Easter is just around the corner, and one of the scriptures that is often read on Easter day is this conversation between Jesus and Mary Magdalene. None of the other gospels record this rather upsetting exchange. When she recognized him, she wanted to hug him with all her might. But before she took a step, Jesus interrupted her with this sudden brush-off.

Were her feelings hurt? Did it feel like a mother does when her child announces that it doesn't want to be cuddled anymore? Or when it doesn't want to hold her hand when they reach the school yard?

When we look at Jesus whole way with people, we know that a brush off just isn't Jesus' style. So maybe something else was happening. What if Jesus was trying to tell her that he didn't come back to life so that their relationship could be the way it was before? Maybe Jesus was saying that the only way that their relationship could *grow*, was if she let go of the way it had been. Maybe Jesus was saying that change is a necessity of life, in order for life to progress and flourish. Perhaps, Jesus was already envisioning the possibilities for a larger faith and life that would exist for the world, when he ascended into heaven.

This brief story suggests wonderful truths for living with faith. Letting go of Jesus' presence as a human being, is what makes it possible for his Spirit to be with everyone, *always*. Letting go, is what makes Christ's love and grace available to us in all times and in all places. Letting go of that life on earth, is what makes it possible for Christ to prepare eternal life for us all in heaven.

This brief story suggests that letting go of old ways, and beliefs set in stone, paves the way for new insights about ourselves and life, and faith. It suggests that letting go of control and fears, paves the way for a new and larger life than we ever dreamed possible, which is precisely a huge part of what Easter is, for us, now and forever.


