### **High Flying Geese**

he following message was received over the internet from The Presbytery of the Northeast Newsletter. The portion from "High Flying Geese" is from a small book by Browne Barr.

"Geese fly in formation. This isn't just for appearance's sake. The downbeat of the lead goose's wings provides an upward push on air to the rear and side. This updraft catches the wings of the next and helps lift them up. It's like having springs in the shoes of us earthbound type. The wing beats of all the geese are sequential. Each goose's flight helps those in the rear.

As a result, ornithologists Peter Lissaman and Carl Shollenberger tested the aerodynamic efficiency of flight formation. According to computer models, 25 geese in formation have a theoretical range increase of 70% as compared to a lone bird. That doesn't count a tail wind.

Geese fly in formation. Geese together are more efficient than a lone goose doing his or her own thing. Formation gives strength. That includes the church. Structure and formation will get churches/presbyteries, etc. to go further in mission.

As the Apostle Paul said, the whole body joined and held together by every supporting ligament grows and builds itself up in love as each does its work.

So too, geese recognize the gift of others. Watch them long enough and you'll see them whiffle. Whiffling is the change of the leading goose. The lead goose will slip to the side, fall back and join the line of geese as another becomes the lead. Leadership is shared rather than burned out.

We rotate leadership. We depend on people stepping forward to help. When churches whiffle, and allow the gifts of members to come forward, we do all things better.

They honk for the weak geese and stray geese, to help one's who have fallen behind find the way back to the flock, or to hold them together in foggy times. In the same way we are to offer words of comfort, encouragement, and support to one another. We are to tell again and again the good news of the gospel to help people find their way back to the flock of the faithful."

There's an old African proverb that states:

If you want to go fast, go alone.

If you want to go far, go together.
